RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Join a national program, <u>Maker Corps</u>, at a local site, Co-Op Summer Enrichment Program in Mamaroneck, NY
- Co-design and co-lead a program block for children grades 1 to 5 with the goal of engaging the kids in projects that leverage creativity and making for the purpose of design and innovation
- Document the Maker Corps work with resources such as blogging, Instagram, and Facebook and writing articles for the local newspapers
- Collaborate with a national network of Maker Corps Members including participating in online training, accessing shared forums and connecting with other Maker Corps sites in our region
- Co-create a personal project with the other Maker Corps Member that serves as a model of a design solution and innovations work for the Co-Op students
- Co-lead at least one community exhibition of the Maker Corps work at Co-Op in order to share the students' ideas and work with the public
- Supervise and assist children in all of their activities with the goals of:
 - o Promoting collaboration among children & staff
 - Establishing a mutual attitude of caring among all children & staff
 - Assisting children with acquiring new skills during their program blocks
 - Infusing all activities with fun
- Participate fully and with enthusiasm in all orientation week training sessions
- Serve as a role model for children by:
 - Arriving on time and fully ready to participate
 - o Working as a team member with other counselors, assistant counselors and staff
 - o Taking joy in learning new things with the children
 - Supporting a drug free, screen free, healthy environment
- Eat lunch with your assigned group, supervise their behavior in the lunchroom and promote positive free play during recess

- Two references only one can be a personal (non-family) reference
